### **3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING**

### **5. SOURCE PROTECTION PLANNING**

#### **Chapter 4: Rosslyn Village Municipal Drinking Water System**

Chapter 4 of the Source Protection Plan was discussed with the Committee. Some concerns regarding the chapter included long sentences and more explanation required regarding the drinking water issues.

The comments from the Committee were collected and will be reviewed and incorporated by Staff where applicable.

#### **Chapter 3: Source Protection Planning Process**

Chapter 3 of the Source Protection Plan was provided to the Committee. It was requested that the Committee return all comments to Staff by Thursday, November 10, 2011.

#### **Source Protection Plan Policy Development**

The Committee was provided with the new Strategic Action Policy for the City of Thunder Bay. The information for the policy was gathered by Staff with help from Guy Jarvis.

It was noted that Staff recommends the buoy be located within proximity of the anchorage perimeter and not the IPZ 1 perimeter due to water depth and location.

It was noted that the policy could cost the City of Thunder Bay roughly \$8,500.00 a year to haul the buoy in and out of the water in the spring and fall.

It was mentioned that our Strategic Action Policy has similar wording to a policy that has been produced by the Cataraqui Source Protection Committee.

The Committee accepted the new policy and it will now be sent out for Pre-Consultation to the City of Thunder Bay.

## Pre-Consultation Presentation to Oliver Paipoonge Council and Staff

It was noted that the SPC Chair and SWP Project Manager made a presentation to Oliver Paipoonge Council and Staff regarding the Draft Policies on October 12, 2011. The Chairman stated that the presentation was very well received and many questions were asked.

To date, no written comments have been received back from the Municipality or any of the Stakeholder Groups that were consulted.

## Source Protection Plan Advisory Committee (SPPAC)

It was noted that the teleconference held on October 20, 2011, was based around the cost of Source Protection Plan Implementation. Costs that have been considered to date include the hiring and employment of a Risk Management Official/Inspector. This does not apply to the Lakehead Source Protection Plan and Area.

For Information purposes, the Committee was provided with an email from Morton Satin of the Salt Institute regarding a request to comment on our Source Protection Policies relating to the application, handling and storage of road salt, and the storage of snow.
